Last year, over 500 South Australians were admitted to hospital for dog bites because even good dogs have bad days. With some helpful safety tips, many of those injuries could have been avoided. Together let's learn more about dog behaviour and bring this number down.



From dogs we don't know to the cuddliest family pet, any dog has the potential to bite for all sorts of reasons. So it's vital we know the situations when and why dogs bite and how we can interact with dogs safely.

Safety tips:

- Always supervise children around dogs at home or in public.
- Never enter a dog's territory, like their bed, yard or toy box.
- A Never startle a dog.
- A Never touch a dog while it's eating.
- A Never touch a dog's puppies without the owner's permission.
- ▲ Never disturb a sleeping dog.
- A Never put your face near a dog's face.
- ▲ Teach children to always ask the owner's permission before approaching a dog.
- Dogs can bite when they're tired, frightened or annoyed. A
- A When approaching a dog, slowly reach to touch its chest from the side. If it retreats, it's time to back off.

Drive or walk the clifftops of Elliston

The SACWA Elliston branch twitchers present the second of the bird series: bring your binoculars, a light camping stool, mobile phone &/or bird ID book. Most recommended sites: Salmon Point drive, Little Bay headland and scrub, heading south.

Driving down the last hill from Bramfield to Elliston, when winter's atmospheric conditions are clear, the near off shore islands stand out against a blue sea. They essentially link many birds to the mainland around the Elliston district, for nightly nesting, breeding and dispersal.

Since the Pleistocene Ice Age the position of the coastline has been affected by cycles of changing climate and sea levels associated with polar icecaps. At the peak of the last glacial phase, about 17, 000 years ago, the sea lay 150m below its present level. As sea level rose to its present coast some 6,000 years before present (YBP), islands became isolated, the furthest out on the continental shelf were isolated first: closest to our shoreline, Ward Is (9,800 YBP), Flinders Is and Topgallant Is (8,400 YBP), and the Waldergraves (7,300 YBP). The current coastline has been slowly eroding for the past 6,000 years.

Cliffs are comprised of calcareous sand dunes hardened to calcarenite rock by the action of percolating rainwater. These are constantly exposed to salt laden spray from mostly south and south westerly winds. Exposure to these winds determine soil and vegetation type, with low shrub behind the cliff face providing a diverse habitat for birds.

Both the white belied sea eagle and the Eastern osprey were listed as occurring on Waldegrave Is. and the mainland. They are endangered species, (conservation of vulnerable and endangered respectively at state level), and home ranges of over 100km square and 15-20km respectively. Both have differing diets, although ranges overlap.

Other birds seen in the past fortnight have included: Little Eagle, (now listed as rare), Pacific gull, Silver gull, Nankeen kestrel, rock parrot, singing honeyeater, Rock dove, Dusky wood swallow, Welcome swallow, Pied oyster catcher, Willy wagtail, Fairy martin, Australian raven, Grey shrike thrush, White browed babbler, Bronze wing pigeon, Grey butcher bird, Crested pigeon.

The White Bellied Sea Eagle:

- * Eat a considerable amount of fish, which they pluck from the water with a trailing foot
- * Also hunt extensively on land, taking a variety of mammals, birds and reptiles
- * Build huge stick nests in trees or on cliff ledges and stacks overlooking the sea
- * Form stable pairs, and will return to the same nest year after year
- * Breeding cycle typically from May to Nov, (some years beginning as early as June), and will actively defend their territory
- * Susceptible to disturbance threats, particularly in courtship/ nesting phase: other threats incl threats by sea eagles, nearby drones, humans in close proximity to nesting areas
- * Soar with their wings held at a steeper angle than the Wedge Tail Eagle
- * Metallic clanking- far carrying: mated pairs duet

Eastern Osprey:

- * Breed on rock stacks or cliffs overlooking the sea, in positions inaccessible from the ground
- * Both male and female rebuild the stick nest, some pairs using the same nest year after year: some nests can become very large structures over 2 meters tall
- * Nests are often lined with seaweed: males will feed the female on the nest, but when youngs' demands for food increase, both parents have to hunt
- * Feed exclusively on fish, (99%) caught in spectacular dives into the water, often plunging a meter underwater to grasp fish in their talons
- * Long razor sharp talons and sharp spines over the base of the foot pads and toes helps to grip and hold slippery fish
- * They also skim low and catch fish on the surface, plucking them with their feet from the water
- * Extremely vulnerable to disturbance: if disturbed defending their nest, eggs and small young can be predated on by gulls and crows
- * Voice: plaintive pee-ee squeals

Rock Parrot

- * Habitat: limestone islands and cliffs, coastal dunes, scrubs, grasslands, swamps
- * Nests in crannies between boulders or under vegetation: breeds from Sept- Nov
- * Highly susceptible to predation from cats and foxes, as a near to ground nester
- * Sedentary: autumn to winter dispersal from islands to nearby coasts
- * Primarily seed eaters, fruits, berries, flowers and insects also taken.
- * Posture upright, flits and settles on rocks, shrub, darts skyward high and fast
- * Rapid series of double notes: tsit- tset, tsit- tset

Dusky swallow

- * Habitat: coastal, adjacent inland scrub, golf course
- * Sits watchfully on exposed branches for insects
- * Birds often huddle together on branches
- * Nest: on horizontal branches: scant nest of twigs
- * Diet: very varied of various forms of foliage, and other grassy material, termites, butterflies on the wing, nectar from flowers

Feral pigeon/ Rock dove/ domestic pigeon

- * Habitat: dunes, beaches, cliffs, islands, buildings, silos, ploughed and grazing paddocks
- * Feeds on the ground: grain eaters and naturally herbivorous, seeking berries, seeds, fruit, on occasions will eat insects, earthworms, snails
- * Basic requirements of food, shelter, water and lack of predation has meant a recent dramatic increase in population
- * Elliston District Council is currently exploring options for reducing population numbers
- * Often nests in cavities and ledges along limestone cliffs excluding native species
- * Feral pigeons also carry diseases which can be transmitted to native species
- We hope you enjoy finding out about what goes on in the area. We welcome feedback or comments about what you are observing.
