BEING MINDFUL: SHARING SPACE IN BREEDING SEASON

Birds that swoop to protect their nest and young, protect their territory or to scavenge food, include:

- Australian Magpie
- Magpie Lark
- Masked Lapwing
- Red Wattlebird
- Silver Gull
- Laughing Kookaburra
- Little Raven
- Australian Pelican

The Masked Lapwing inhabits marshes, mudflats, beaches and grasslands. It is often seen in urban areas. Where this bird is used to human presence, it may tolerate close proximity; otherwise it is very wary of people, and seldom allows close approach.

Masked Lapwings feed on insects and their larvae, and earthworms. Most food is obtained from just below the surface of the ground, but some may also be taken above the surface. Birds are normally seen feeding alone, in pairs or in small groups.

The species can be often observed along the Esplanade and around adjacent bays in Elliston and are considered a resident species. They are monogamous on a long-term basis; and are very faithful to their breeding site

During nesting, they usually give off a high-pitched warning call, to let you know they are there, sitting on their nest. Then, if you get too close, they might hop off the nest and some will swoop you.

It's just a warning to let you know you're in their area — they won't usually make contact. There is one display where they will puff out their chest and open up their wings as big as they can, and then slowly walk towards you. If they feel like they are being threatened, or if they feel they need to be aggressive, you will be able to see the spurs pop out — and they can nick you with that.

The best thing to do if you are being swooped, or visiting an area you know is home to nesting lapwings, is keep your

head down and move slowly. Running and cycling is more likely to aggravate the birds, compared to slow walking. Respect their shared space.


