KEEP YOUR EYES PEELED

We'd like to remind everyone about an ongoing concern in our district—African Boxthorns. Although we've effectively managed these invasive plants along our roadsides, it's important to stay vigilant.

African boxthorns are known for their ability to spread quickly. Their berries, which contain seeds, are easily dispersed by birds and other animals. Given the seeds' long viability, new plants often emerge each year, despite control efforts. These thorny invaders pose significant threats by crowding out native vegetation, disrupting local habitats, and overrun pastures. They can also form thick tangles that provide hiding spots for pests like rabbits and foxes.

Our dedicated Elliston Landscape Officer has been actively implementing various control strategies on roadside infestations and will continue to monitor for any new growth. Your assistance is invaluable. If you come across any African boxthorns, please report them to the Eyre Peninsula Landscape Board so appropriate action can be taken.

Where does Australia sit? HPIA (highly pathogenic avian influenza) in wild birds

The SACWA Elliston branch present the next of our bird article for your interest.

This month, I am focusing on a serious potential threat to our native wildlife. We all should be aware of the current situation around the world in relation to the HPIA (highly pathogenic avian influenza), commonly referred to as H5N1. Oceania (Australia and New Zealand) is the only part of the world currently free.

Whilst the H5N1 has not yet been detected in Australia, it has breached the sub-Antarctic islands. Two dead Skuas tested positive for H5N1. It is postulated that skuas carried the virus from sub-Antarctic Falkland Islands and South Georgia Island and carried the deadly strain from South America. There has been international cooperation from Antarctic research teams and testing of dead birds.

The greatest period of risk for Australia is predicted from September, the start of spring, when our migratory shore birds return from Siberia and Europe.

Australian Centre for Disease Preparedness senior research scientist Frank Wong said northern Australia's remotness could pose surveillance challenges.

Australia was not on the flight paths of large migratory water birds such as ducks and geese that travelled long distances and had helped spread the H5N1 bird flu around the world. But authorities said birds from Asia that came into contact with infected migratory birds could bring the virus to Australia. They said there was also a risk from the south of the country after an elephant seal was found dead in Antarctica with the H5N1 virus.




