GAZANIA MANAGEMENT

The Eyre Peninsuola Landscape Board have been implementing measures for the management and control of the pest plant Gazania. Gazania is a weed that is often mistaken for an ornamental plant because if its colourful flowers. This weed thrives in our climate and is particularly destructive for our coastal dunes and along roadsides where it forms mat-like colonies that can exclude all other plants, leading to a decline in biodiversity. Once established, it can be very hard to control.

For effective control, the entire plant, including it's root system should be dug out. Minimal disturbance techniques should be employed. It is reccomended that you first remove and bag the flower heads to prevent seed dispersal and place them in your rubbish bin for deep burial. In situations where the plant cannot be removed, flower heads should be taken off before setting seed. This will prevent further spread of seed. A minimal level of control is to mow, or brush cut the flowers before they develop and set seed.

Control is most effective when the plant is actively growing between June to November. This can be defined as having new lush foliage and flowering. Don't spray when the plant is visibly under stress such as wilted.

TOUGH LOVE CREATES A SUCCESSFUL JUVENILE

The SACWA Elliston branch present the next of our bird article for your interest

The journey to full adulthood for a young Pacific Gull is a patient process, spanning approximately four to five years. This intricate timeline showcases the gradual development of the bird's plumage, and behaviours. Each stage in this transformative journey contributes to the overall majesty and resilience of the Pacific Gull.

At the end of four years of nurturing, tough love may be required. Parents reduce the frequency of feeding, encouraging the young to forage on their own. Parents will spend more time away from their young, prompting them to explore and fend for themselves. Parents might exhibit more aggressive or dismissive behaviours to signal that it is time to leave. And parents might lead their young to new areas and leave them to explore independently.

Young typically fledge after about 5- 6 weeks, then will take four years to reach maturity. Parents teach survival skills, foraging, hunting and avoiding predators like eagles, hawks, and falcons as significant threats. Foxes and cats prey on eggs and chicks and even adult birds.

Staying with parents helps them to develop social behaviours and understand their place within the flock. Young are more vulnerable to predators, and staying with parents provides added protection. Gradual independence allows the young to gain confidence and independence before venturing out on their own.

Four year olds are encouraged to explore new areas often forming groups with other juveniles: there is safety in numbers. They learn from each other by observing feeding techniques and other survival skills.

They learn social interaction, which develops social bonds and establishes their place within the larger gull community.

As an adult, their diet consists of aquatic invertebrates such as molluscs, squid, crabs, sea urchins, and an array of crustaceans that graze the ocean floor. Yet, this seabird is not bound by dietary constraints, extending its gastronomic reach to include fish, small seabirds, eggs, nestlings, and even carrion, creating a menu that mirrors the dynamic and ever-changing nature of its coastal habitat. Targeting crabs and sea urchins as its primary prey, it seizes its unsuspecting prey and, with a calculated drop from an altitude of about 10 to 15 meters, endeavors to crack open the protective shells upon impact with the rocky surfaces below. They feed by patrolling beaches and intertidal zones and sometimes plunge-diving.

Breeding occurs from September to January. A mature single bird will start by selecting and defending a specific territory, often near other nesting sites. This involves aggressive behaviours like vocalisations and physical displays to ward off intruders. These behaviours keep them secure and safe, and a resource rich area for attracting a mate and raising their young.




