THE RED WATTLEBIRD

The Elliston Branch, SACWA, are pleased to present the red wattle bird, noisy birds, producing a range of raucous calls. Pairs of birds appear to duet, particularly at food sources, with the male producing a loud cackle and the female a whistling call.

Many would be aware of the loud and raucous calls of the red wattlebird and its territorial behaviour. You can quite clearly in the near distance of the golf course hear the calls of 'yak-yak-yak, or a loud coughing 'kwok".

The Red Wattlebird is a large honeyeater with distinctive red wattles hanging from its cheeks. Its plumage is primarily grey-brown, with a streaked chest and prominent white patches on the wings and tail. Both sexes look similar, with juveniles having smaller wattles and duller plumage. The bird's size and wattles become more pronounced as it matures.

Red Wattlebirds are endemic to Australia and are found across the southern and eastern parts of the continent. They inhabit a variety of woodland environments, including eucalyptus forests, coastal heathlands, and urban parks. They particularly feed on Eucalyptus, banksia and callistemon in community gardens. Plant some, and you will be assured of guests. Wattlebirds feed on nectar, which they obtain by probing flowers with its thin curved bill. Some insects are also eaten, taken either from foliage or caught in mid-air. Berries and the honeydew produced by some insects add to the bird's diet.

Many scientific bird names describe a bird's habits, habitat, distribution or a plumage feature, while others are named after their discoverers or in honour of prominent ornithologists.

In Aboriginal Australia, when linguists were building a dictionary for a language and compiling names for different types of birds, it was possible to record three things: the bird name, a word that represents its call, and a customary imitation of its call. Aboriginal languages are rich in onomatopoeic (sounding like the calls they make) bird names. In the Barngarla language of lower Eyre Peninsula, the term ngarkarko for species of the red wattlebird, due to the similarity with its call.

The local people of Denial Bay north of Ceduna call it noggal, and the Ngarrindjeri people of the Lower lakes and Murray region know it as rungkan.

The red wattlebird was first described in 1790, by naturalist John White. It's classification is as follows: Genus: Anthochaera from ancient Greek - Anthos meaning flower and bloom, and khairo meaning enjoy. Species name: caruncula, Latin for a small piece of flesh Anthochaera is a genus of birds in the honeyeater family, and includes the little wattlebird, the red wattlebird, the western wattlebird, and the yellow wattlebird.

Caruncles are sometimes secondary sexual characteristics, having a more intense colour or even a different colour, developing as the male reaches sexual maturity.

Caruncles are also ornamental elements used by males to attract females to breeding. Having large caruncles or colourfully bright ones indicates high levels of testosterone, that they are well-fed birds able to elude other predators thus showing the good quality of their genes. Many species from a variety of families have caruncles, including: pheasants, roosters and turkeys, falcons, eagles, cassowaries, ibises and spoonbills, lapwings, swans, ducks and geese, cuckoos, cockatoos, parrots and honeyeaters. If you google caruncles you can discover the range of features in the birds listed above.

Common names of the red wattlebird include gillbird, gilly warbler and barking bird.



Northern Eyre Health Care Project

Northern Eyre Health Care is an innovative pilot project aiming to improve access to the wide range of healthcare services in and around Elliston, and the wider region.

The project's scope involves primary health careyour first point of contact with the health system, such as a GP, nurse, allied health or mental health professional.

However, in considering the healthcare needs, the project will take into account connections between other levels of healthcare, including secondary care - from specialists you might be referred on to, and tertiary care - in a hospital setting.

Why is my input needed?

Healthcare service providers and community organisations are working together to design a service delivery model that will support the health and wellbeing of residents. To develop the best plan, they need to understand your experiences and needs.

Hard copies of surveys are available at Mid Eyre Medical Elliston, Elliston Community & Visitor Information Centre, District Council of Elliston office and online at https://yoursay.sa.gov.au/elliston-have-your-say

The project team will be visiting Elliston on **Thursday 13 February**, setting up a listening post in front of the Elliston Friendly Grocer between **11am and 1pm**. You can drop by to learn more about the project, provide feedback on local healthcare services and have your say via the project survey.

The community and stakeholder feedback will contribute to co-design of a suitable model of healthcare delivery to the region, which will be trialled over 2026-2027.



The app is available for free download from the app store (Android and Apple).

Visit the Apple App Store or Google Play Store and search for 'Alert SA'. Follow the download prompts. The app does not require a sign up or log in.

Once downloaded, you should check push notifications are enabled in your phone settings and review your notification preferences.







Creating Watch Zones

To receive notifications, a Watch Zone needs to be created. To do this, follow the below steps:

- Select 'My Watch Zones' in the bar menu then select 'Add new Watch Zone'.
- Drop a pin on the map at your selected location or tap the search button to enter an address.
- Add a name for your watch zone and adjust the radius to the desired distance.
- Select 'Create Watch Zone' or 'Add to Watch List' *Depending on device type

You can create up to 10 watch zones at any one time.
