THE AUSTRALIAN KESTREL

The SACWA Elliston branch presents the next of our bird articles for your interest.

The Australian Kestrel, also known as the Nankeen Kestrel, Sparrow Hawk, or Windhover is a master of hovering and stooping techniques.

Driving the highways and dirt roads from Elliston, it would be unusual not to observe a kestrel hovering over paddocks and grassland and remaining stationary against the wind.

These birds belong to the falcon family, and are in the top most commonly seen birds, recorded in 95% of survey sites located across the whole of Australia. Their success as a bird of prey can be largely attributed to its tolerance for a wide variety of habitats and its ability to feed on a variety of foods and nest in a range of sites.

Their ability to hunt using their ultraviolet light vision is a key adaptation. Rodents mark their trails with urine and faeces, which can be seen in ultraviolet but not visible light.

Yet the success rate of fledglings is 0.32, and adults in their first year 0.69. So what environmental pressures are limiting the population size?

From below looking up at the hovering bird, it appears off white/ buff coloured, with a black tail edge and black wing tips. When viewed from a fencepost/dead tree/vantage point, the body is mostly rufous with some dark streaking. The male has a greyish crown and tail. The female is larger, and more heavily marked, with a rufous head and tail. Young kestrels closely resemble the adult female.

Renown for its hovering abilities, prey is located from a perch or hovering with rapid wing beats up to 10-20m above the ground into the wind. Using the wind to stay buoyant, the kestrel uses its fan shaped tail as a rudder and keeps the body and head still. Once located, it makes a rapid head first dive of about 35km/hr, until it is closer to the ground, then pounces/grabs the prey with both claws and kills by a bite to the back of the skull using its strong beak.

Sometimes prey is caught on the wing, particularly insects, arthropods, or snatched from tree branches. The diet mainstay is arthropods such as insects, centipedes and spiders, also mice, small mammals, young rabbits, small birds, lizards, small bats, snakes, frogs, earthworms and fish.

Many kestrels do not manage to secure a mate or breeding territory until their second year. Courtship is in the winter in the colder months, and they usually stay together over successive breeding seasons. They use tree hollows, a nest of mud or sticks abandoned by another species (including corvids, other raptors, babblers and choughs), ledges and cavities in cliffs or buildings.

Usually about 4 eggs are laid, with the female incubating the eggs while the male brings the food. Towards fledgling, both sexes leave the nest to hunt for food. Multiple broods are raised in good seasons.

Population size can be directly related to the seasons, and pressure from prey including falcons, hawks, larger owls, snakes, large lizards, cats and foxes. Fledglings are particularly susceptible to ground based species. Other threats include rat and mouse poison laid during heavy plague infestation.

Airports provide added danger, with the kestrel listed in the top 10 struck species from the Australian Transport Safety Authority.

Kestrals find airport signs, navigation and lighting infrastructure attractive perching sites, while the open grassland environment can harbor preferred species such as crickets.



Aged care services available to all Australians

This month the spotlight is on the services to help us as we get older and need different supports, and often we need help to navigate accessing them. There are a range of information services and supports available to Australians – regardless of where you live.

My Aged Care - where your journey starts

Accessing government-funded aged care support in Australia starts with the umbrella organisation, My Aged Care.

Through My Aged Care, you can then access aged care supports such as:


- The Commonwealth Home Support Program for low-level support at home,
- Home Care packages delivered in the home and community,
- Residential aged care (living in an aged care facility), and
- Respite services.

How to access My Aged Care:

Apply for an assessment to find out if you are eligible for government-funded aged care services.

Call 1800 200 422 or apply online at www.myagedcare.gov.au/assessment/apply-online

Staff in all Services Australia service centres can help with general information about My Aged Care services, and help you use the My Aged Care website and upload your documents, as well as connect you with specialised assistance.



When should I register for My Aged Care?

If you are over 65 years of age* and:

- need help with everyday tasks
- have noticed a change in what you can do or remember
- have been diagnosed with a medical condition or reduced mobility
- have experienced a change in family care arrangements, or
- had a recent fall or hospital admission.

*The eligible age for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people is 50 years and over.

Navigation services and sourcing equipment

Care Finder

Many older Australians face barriers to accessing aged care and health services - especially those who struggle with using online and digital platforms (or don't want to), who have illness or cognitive decline, who don't have help from family or friends, have language or cultural barriers, or are at risk of homelessness.

The Care finder program helps people:

- navigate the aged care and health system
- make referrals and applications
- attend assessments/appointments
- connect to supports and programs
- access ongoing, face to face support

Within Eyre Peninsula, the organisation contracted to deliver the Care Finder Program is Country & Outback Health. To connect with Care Finder, phone 8644 4900, or complete an online form at cobh.com.au/care-finder

Care finder is a free service, thanks to funding from Country SA Primary Health Network (PHN).



Equipment Program

(Department Human Services SA)

Funds eligible South Australians for equipment like:

- mobility aids (walkers, frames, sticks)
- seating and pressure management (pressure cushions, postural support)
- adjustable beds, rails, over-bed tables
- bathroom (shower chairs, commodes)
- transfer aids (hoists and slings)
- scooters and powered wheelchairs
- communication aids



and home modifications like:

- bathroom grab rails, accessible showers, and non-slip flooring
- lowered kitchen benchtops and accessible storage solutions
- ramps, widened doorways, stair modifications
- and safety enhancements like alarm systems and improved lighting

To access this service, ask an occupational therapist (OT) or physiotherapist for an assessment - they can submit a request for you. Once approved, the equipment or modifications are arranged or funded by the program
