## ROCK PARROT

Walk along the trail toward Wellington Head in the late afternoon, heading to the opening of Waterloo Bay in Elliston, and you enter the habitat of the rock parrot. At first glance, it appears windswept and exposed, lacking shelter from prevailing westerly and southerly winds, and inhospitable for many species.

Yet the rock parrot holds its ground. It is tame, quiet and unobtrusive, living almost exclusively along coastlines, offshore rocky islands, coastal sand dunes and saline swamps. It is rarely seen more than a few hundred metres from the sea. A native bird survey of Waterloo Bay in February 2026 by the SA Landscape Board (Anna, Zephyr, Skip and Gemma) recorded a rich diversity of species including hooded plovers, grey teal, ruddy turnstones, red capped plovers, Caspian terns, pied cormorants and sooty oystercatchers, alongside seven rock parrots. Time of day is critical. While that survey occurred in the morning, a late afternoon observation in March 2026 at Wellington Head (G and S Fieldhouse) recorded flocks of 14 and then approximately 26 rock parrots. How has this parrot endured in such a harsh environment?

Its diet consists of seeds from native grasses and low growing shrubs including pigface, coastal daisy bushes, glasswort, saltbush and species of acacia.

Breeding typically occurs on offshore islands, with nests well hidden in burrows, crevices or under ledges. These may be reused from shearwaters or storm petrels, sometimes with nests only metres apart.

Physiologically, the rock parrot is highly adapted. It can drink seawater, using specialised salt glands to filter excess salt. It has also developed gut bacteria that allow it to digest samphire seeds, toxic to many other species.

Despite having the least colourful plumage of any Australian parrot, it is a resilient species. Mostly terrestrial, it shelters in dense shrubs or under rocks, and is usually seen in pairs or small groups.

They display sentinel behaviour, taking turns to watch for predators while others feed, and forage mainly in the early morning and late afternoon. Pairs form strong, lifelong bonds. It may not be as famous as the night parrot or the orange bellied parrot, but the rock parrot is a quiet survivor, holding its place along our coastline despite the pressures around it.

## ELLISTON ESPLANADE INTEGRATED COASTAL FORESHORE MANAGEMENT PLAN – FINAL CONSULTATION

The District Council of Elliston is currently undertaking a final stage of community consultation on the Elliston Esplanade Integrated Coastal Foreshore Management Plan.

This follows an earlier engagement period between November 2025 and February 2026, which included a public information session and written submissions. Feedback from the community highlighted key priorities such as stormwater and erosion management, dune stabilisation, protecting vegetation, maintaining the existing road alignment, and a preference for low-impact, nature-based solutions. Concerns around overdevelopment of the foreshore were also strongly noted.

The revised Plan has been developed in response to this feedback and focuses on staged, adaptable works that prioritise coastal protection while aligning with the Coastal Hazard Adaptation Plan (CHAP). Importantly, the Plan does not propose any road widening or expansion and aims to avoid overinvestment within sensitive coastal areas. This final consultation provides an opportunity for the community to review the updated Plan and make a final submission prior to Council consideration.



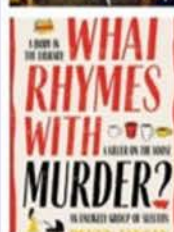

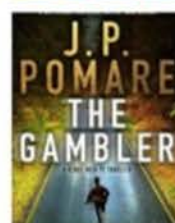

#### COMMUNITY UPDATE - Elliston Gym (Bucky's Gym)

I wanted to share an update on how things are progressing with the proposed Elliston Gym, and to take a moment to acknowledge the incredible effort from across our community.

Firstly, a huge thank you to everyone involved in Bucky Fest on 21 March 2026. It was a fantastic day and night, full of great music, connection and community spirit. Events like this really show what Elliston is all about, bringing people together for something bigger than themselves.

Importantly, the event also raised valuable funds to help move the gym project forward, but just as importantly, it strengthened the sense of connection that sits at the heart of this project.

The Council is continuing to work closely with the organisers of Bucky's Beach Relay, coming up in July. This incredible initiative will see participants run 720km from Adelaide to Elliston to raise funds for a new community gym, with a goal of at least \$300,000.

Council is supporting the organisers to help deliver the event and is also working strategically with them to explore opportunities to partner with State and Federal governments to maximise additional funding for the project.

A few important updates I want the community to be aware of:

- All funds raised through community events and fundraising are being quarantined into a dedicated account, ensuring they are protected and used specifically for the new Gym.
- Council will fund the planning and early investigation work required to progress the project, including concept development and any necessary groundwork.

Looking ahead, Council will be holding a community meeting in mid/late June, and everyone is warmly invited to attend. This will be an opportunity to start sharing ideas and talking about what the gym could look like, so it truly reflects the needs of all of our community members.

At the same time, I want to be open and transparent, until we have a clearer understanding of the total funds raised through these events (and any additional funding opportunities), it's difficult to go too far into detailed design. I know there is a lot of excitement, which is fantastic, but I also want to make sure we don't raise expectations beyond what may realistically be achievable. As funding becomes clearer, Council will be in a much better position to work with the community on more detailed plans.

This is a really positive project for Elliston, one that supports health, wellbeing and connection, and it's only possible because of the passion and commitment of this community.

Thanks again to everyone who has contributed so far. We'll continue to keep you updated as things progress.

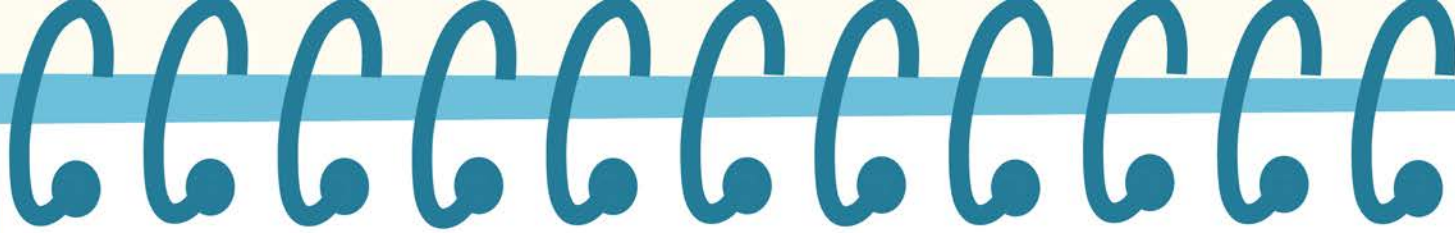
